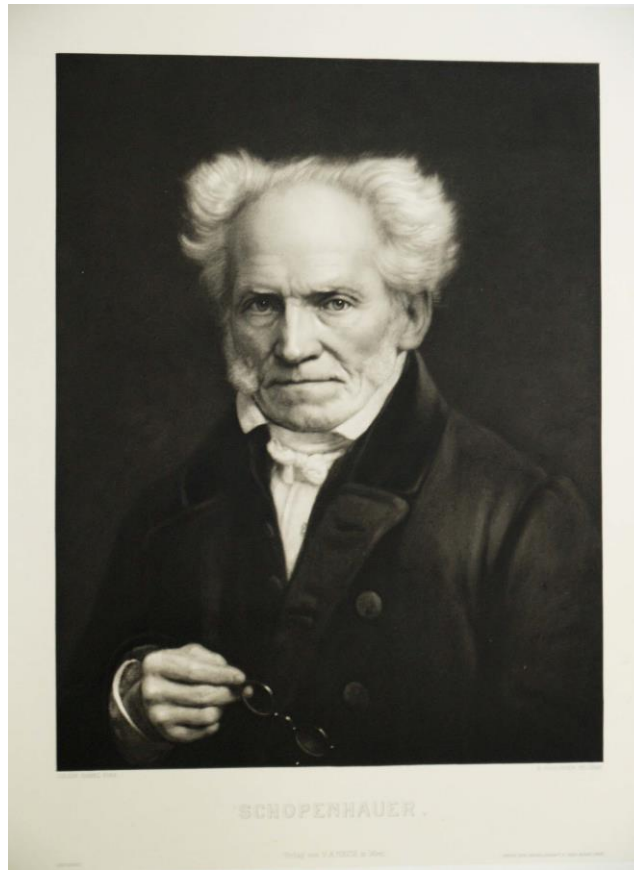


With his famous main work „The World as Will and Representation“, which appeared 200 years ago (at the end of 1818 while it was printed with the date 2019), Arthur Schopenhauer intended a work which is “ethics and metaphysics in one”. In his interpretation of the world as characterized by the will to live life itself has an ethical significance, which constitutes humanity in modern world. In a narrower sense ethics in Schopenhauer occurs as ethics of compassion and as denial of the will to live, referring explicitly to Hindu and Buddhist conceptions

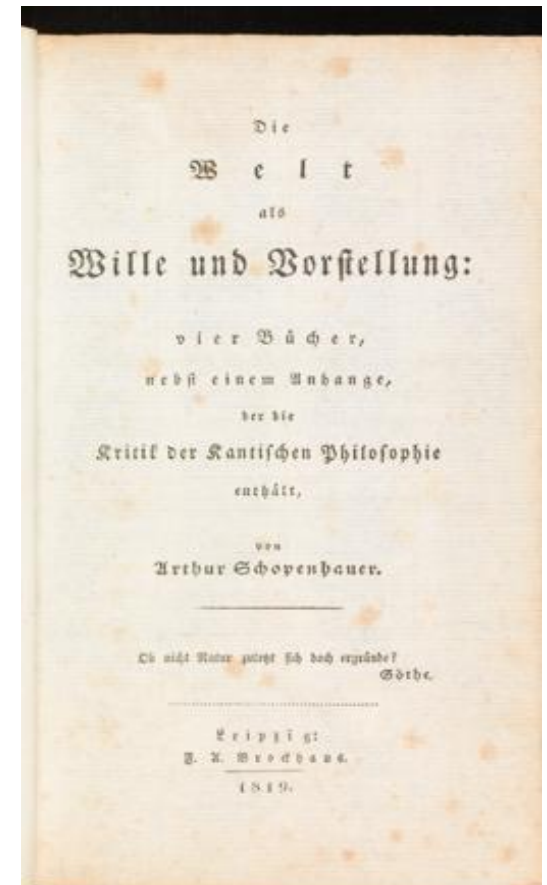
