From 19 March to 22 May 2024, in Ferrara (Italy), the exhibition *Kant24/Dare to know!* (in Italian, English, and German) will shine light on the high-water marks of the European Enlightenment, with a particular emphasis upon events in the lives of Enlightenment philosophers and their place in popular culture. For the first time ever, the first editions of Kant's major philosophical works will be on public display in Italy (curators: A. Falduto, H. F. Klemme, J. Timmermann).

The [exhibition](#) will be inaugurated with a stage performance (*The Law and the Candle*) on 19 March 2024 at 6:00 pm. The theatrical staging is the product of a workshop organised by the University Centre for Theatre in Ferrara and conducted by the Teatro dell'Argine from Bologna.
