since 2002, the IDSS (Indian Division of the Schopehauer Society) and the Faculty of Philosophy of Deshbandhu College are organizing a series of lectures called Schopen-hauer and Indian Philosophy Lectures. This is instituted in honor of Arthur Schopenhauer, a prominent German Philosopher who admired Upanishads and introduced it to the Western world. He was a well-known scholar in Indian Philosophy and Western Philosophy. Next year, the Faculty of Philosophy organizes an international seminar on the theme:

"The Intersection of Upanishads, Schopenhauer, and Ecology: Philosophical Insights for Contemporary Environmental Challenges".

In the light of the above perspectives, this interdisciplinary seminar focuses chiefly, but not exclusively, on the following themes/topics.

Themes:

- 1. Schopenhauer and the Upanishads: Schopenhauer and Upanishads, Readings of texts from Sanskrit Literature, Vedic literature & Schopenhauer's *The World as Will and Representation*.
- Schopenhauer and Ecology: Philosophical Aspects of Hinduism as Interpreted by Sankara and Schopenhauer.
- 3. Schopenhauer and Indian philosophical systems on Ecology
 The foundation and conception of ethics in Schopenhauer and Indian Philosophy
- 4. Schopenhauer and India

Objectives:

- Discuss physically conscious considerations of the Upanishads and Schopenhauer.
- Evaluate its applicability in the current ecological issues the planet is facing.
- Invite dialogues about how philosophy influences environmental policy.
- Encourage students, academics, and policy professionals to address the interrelation of ethics and philosophy in a green context, with environmental values and concerns

- 15 Nov. 2025: Notification regarding paper selection
- 30 Dec. 2025: Submission of your final paper

• You are invited to write a paper within 5,000 words on any of the suggested themes or that of your choice, related to the seminar theme.

- The abstract of your paper should not exceed 400 words.

- The presented papers will be published in a book form.
